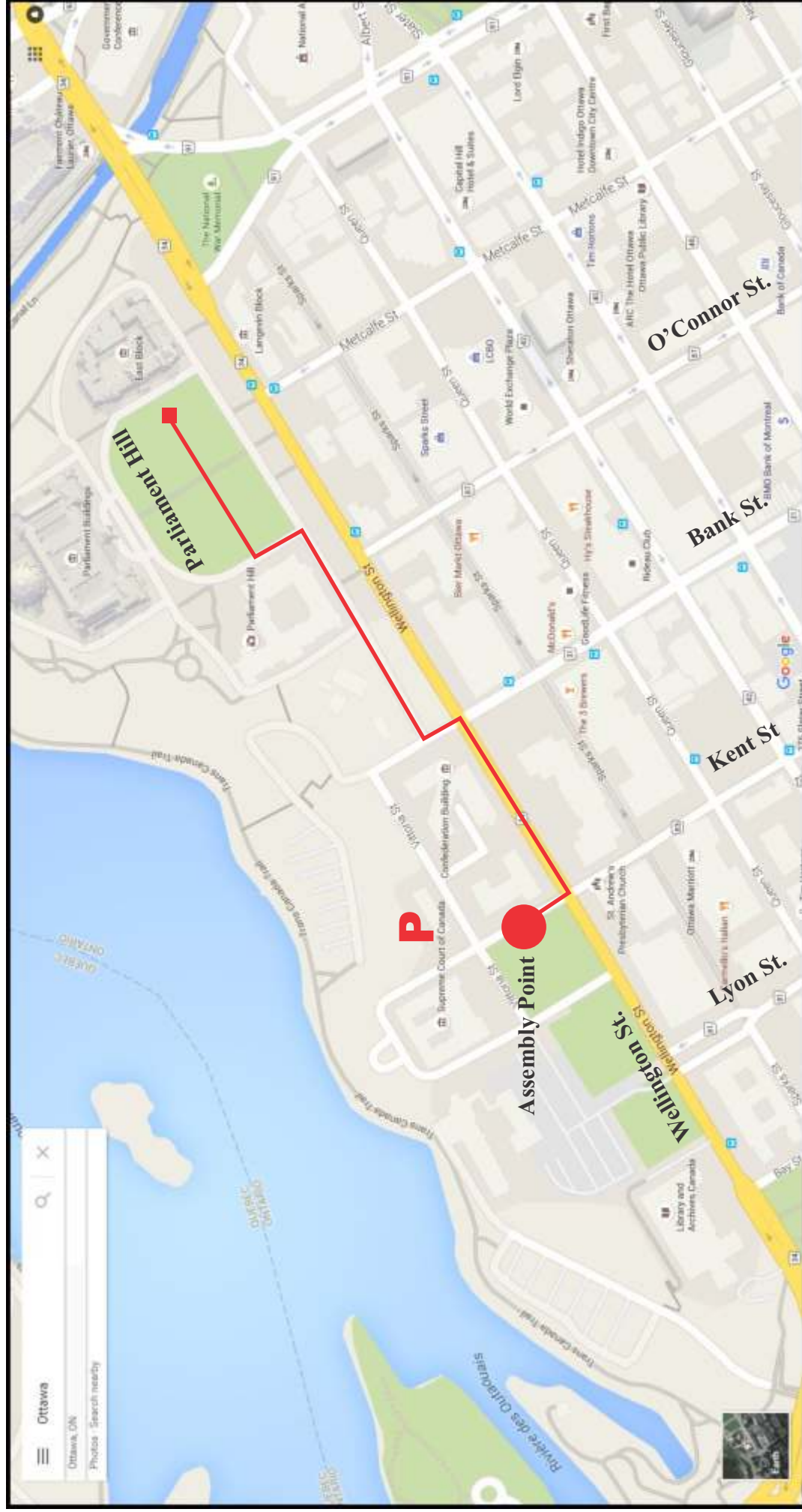

Parking: We usually park in the lot marked with **P**. There are other lots in the area.

If driving, be sure to allow yourself lots of time – there are police all over the place blocking traffic to the Hill; tell them you are part of the parade. The map shows the **Assembly Point** for the parade. The parade begins at **10:20 am sharp**. There will be a **tune-up** for the pipers in an area close to the Supreme Court building at an earlier time — don't know exactly when, but let's say 9:45 am.

We will be assigned to one of the three massed pipe bands (usually the second massed band) and will be assigned the tunes to play. The parade route to Parliament Hill is shown above; the parade off the Hill goes to the southwest corner of the Parliament Hill lawn.

Bring your water bottle !!

During the service, flex your leg muscles, make small leg movements, etc.; drink water. You do not want to embarrass yourself by becoming a “Piper Down!” or a “Drummer Down!”
